



Not Just a Building, A Beacon

Over the past few months, we've developed an *invitation statement* that welcomes others, recognizing the church as, "A place to gather. A Community in which to belong." Seeking to serve our congregation and the many folks in our community we welcome into our doors and onto our property, we will be undertaking some specific projects in the months to come.

- Installation of a ramp leading into the kitchen in the rear of the building. This access ramp will enable easier usage of our building, establish an additional barrier free entry, and allow us to continue to host voting and blood drives in Fellowship Hall.
- Front porch maintenance. We are rebuilding our front sanctuary porch and stairs. We do not intend to change the look or use, but ensure the safety and function of the front entrance for years to come.
- Painting of the steeple, columns, and side of the church. After reviewing a number of bids, consistory has hired a local company to scrape, prep, paint, and do small repairs on the columns, steeple, front façade, and driveway facing exterior wall, getting underway any day!

As you might imagine, these projects will involve an investment of time and finances to keep up the maintenance and care of our "beacon of a building". A generous lead gift of \$10,000 has been received. Consistory has approved an additional \$43,000 from our Capital Reserve Fund, which will exhaust what we have set aside for these projects. "Understanding the Bible" with Dr. J. Todd Billings

For three-consecutive Sundays in May (May 12, 19, and 26), we will be showing a video lecture series entitled "Understanding the Bible" after worship in Fellowship Hall. The mini lectures are provided by Pastor Jake's academic mentor from seminary, Dr. J. Todd

Billings, Professor of Reformed Theology at Western Theological

Community Movie

Nicaragua Mission CEPAD/ El Castillo

For nearly 20 years, an important part of the DRC Mission Work is our outreach in Nicaragua and partnership with the rural community of El Castillo. More than 40 members of DRC, including a dozen-plus young people, have traveled on Mission trips to Nicaragua. We met the people of El Castillo in 2010 and created our Covenant Partnership with the community in 2013.

All our work has been facilitated by CEPAD—the Council of Evangelical Churches of Nicaragua. More than 50 years ago, Nicaraguan church leaders formed CEPAD to provide disaster relief after an earthquake destroyed much the country.

Since then, CEPAD has continued to development such as:

- Leadership Training,
- Pastoral Education

CEPAD also helps churches visit Nicaragua and, as in our case, to develop covenant partnerships with rural communities. Partnerships are based on the mutual respect and needs of each partner.

We spent several years discerning with our Partners what that could look like. We observed that the community had a strong love of education. But in Nicaragua most students don't make it to high school and far fewer still to college. Families don't have the money, and the children are needed to work. For El Castillo and nearby communities, there is just one high school AND only on weekends. It can be up to a 2 hour walk one way to attend.

The El Castillo community leaders enthusiastically agreed when we suggested a college scholarship program. So many in our congregation have sustained this program with your gifts. Thank you for helping these young people reach their dreams. There are 20 attending college this year.

It hasn't been easy for the students -- especially with COVID, but some really wonderful things have come out of this:

- More children are staying in school thru high school-- families tell us students are staying in school because they have hope
- ♦One teaches in the elementary school in El Castillo.
- ♦ Another helps local farmers with sustainable agriculture practices.

This is an exciting mission area with a lot coming up this year. Get involved right away:

- CEPAD mission workers Jhan and Ian Vellega will visit DRC June 28-30. July 19-26 RCA invites young people ages 18-30 to visit CEPAD and see their work in Nicaragua. Scholarships are available -- sign up by May 18. August 4-10 all adults are invited to visit CEPAD in Managua with day trips
- to communities. It is a perfect introduction to this ministry. September 20-27, Help us host a delegation of three visitors from our Partnership in El Castillo. Can you help us plan the visit? Or maybe:
 - •invite them for lunch or dinner?
 - •take them on a walking tour of Delmar?
 - •host a BBQ and corn hole challenge?
